**PUBLIC OPINION DIVIDED ON GAS PUMP STICKERS BUT
OPPOSITION TO \$10,000 FINE VERY HIGH IN NEW POLL**

**PLURALITY SUPPORTS BEER/WINE IN CORNER STORES BUT COST OF
GETTING OUT OF BEER STORE CONTRACT MAKES IT 2 TO 1 AGAINST**

MAJORITY OPPOSES NEW LICENSE PLATES

**STRONG OPPOSITION TO GOVERNMENT TEACHER
CUTS, CLASS SIZE INCREASES, ONLINE COURSES**

Key Findings

- **Awareness of gas pump sticker and other policies is high:** Seven-in-ten voters are aware the provincial government plans to put anti-carbon tax stickers on gas pumps (71%), and this is especially the case among those who approve of Doug Ford (81%). This is similar to levels of awareness of other policies tested here.
- **Voters are evenly split on support for gas pump stickers:** Just more than a third support the gas pump sticker policy (36%), and a very similar proportion oppose it (37%), most "strongly" (29%). About one fifth are neutral (neither support nor oppose - 22%).
- **There is strong opposition to fining gas stations \$10,000 for not displaying stickers:** Just one quarter of voters support the policy of fining gas stations which do not display the stickers at an amount of \$10,000 a day (25%), while twice this many, the majority, oppose this idea (52%), most of them "strongly" (40%).
- **Plurality supports beer and wine in corner stores:** Four-in-ten voters support the policy of selling beer and wine in convenience stores (42%), while one third oppose this idea (34%).

- **If getting out of Beer Store contract costs \$1 billion, support falls:** If it is explained that getting out of the Beer Store's exclusive contract might cost the province \$1 billion, support for beer and wine in convenience stores falls to one third (33%), while opposition increases to 6-in-10 (59%), most of them "strongly opposed" (42%).
- **One half oppose new license plates, just one fifth support them:** Close to one half oppose the new license plates after being exposed to renderings (48%), most of them "strongly" (33%). Just one fifth approve (20%).
- **Majority would rather keep old plate, reject new plate:** Close to 6-in-10 respondents would prefer to keep their old plate (58%), while fewer than one fifth think the new plate should be adopted (16%).
- **Two thirds oppose cuts to teachers by attrition:** Fully two thirds of Ontario voters oppose the Ford government's plan to eliminate more than 3000 teaching jobs in the next four years (62%), most of them "strongly" (48%), while fewer than one quarter support this plan (23%).
- **One half oppose increase in elementary school class sizes:** One half oppose increases in class size in elementary schools from 23 to 24 students (47%), most "strongly" (35%), while 3-in-10 support the plan (30%).
- **Six-in-ten oppose increasing class sizes in high school:** Six-in-ten oppose the policy of increasing high school classes from 22 to 28 students (59%), most "strongly" (44%), while just one quarter support it (25%).
- **Majority oppose required online courses:** The majority oppose the plan to require high school students to take at least 4 online courses (57%), most of them "strongly" (39%), while just one fifth support it (21%).

Detailed Findings

One third support stickers, one third do not

TORONTO, MAY 7, 2019 - In a sampling of public opinion taken by Corbett Communications on May 2 and 3, 2019, among 1836 Ontario voters, one third support the gas pump sticker policy (36%), and a very similar proportion oppose it (37%). Past PC voters support the policy (56%) at about the same rate past Liberal voters (50%) and other parties oppose it. Those who approve of Doug Ford are especially likely to support the idea (64%).

Majority oppose \$10,000 fine for not displaying gas pump sticker

More than half the voters in Ontario oppose the \$10,000 fine for not displaying the stickers (52%), and most oppose it strongly (40%). Opposition is highest among past Liberal, NDP and Green voters (52%, 60%, 47%, respectively).

Awareness of gas pump sticker policy is high

Seven-in-ten are aware the provincial government plans to put anti-carbon tax stickers on every gas pump in the province (71%). Awareness is especially high among those who approve of Doug Ford (81%), the oldest (80%) and those certain to vote (81%).

Plurality supports beer and wine in corner stores

Four-in-ten voters support the policy of selling beer and wine in convenience stores (42%), while one third oppose this idea (34%). Support is highest in Eastern Ontario (32% strongly support), among past PC supporters (36%) and among those who approve of Doug Ford (35%). Opposition is characteristic of females (28% strongly oppose), in Northern Ontario (28%) and among past New Democrats (31%).

If getting out of Beer Store contract costs \$1 billion, support falls

When it is explained that getting out of the Beer Store's exclusive contract might cost the province \$1 billion, support for beer and wine in convenience stores falls to one third (33%), while opposition increases to 6-in-10 (59%), most of them "strongly opposed" (42%). Strong opposition is characteristic of females (50%), the oldest (49%), past NDP voters (55%) and those certain to vote (48%).

One half opposes new license plates, just one fifth support them

Close to one half oppose the new license plates after being exposed to renderings (48%), most of them "strongly" (33%). Just one fifth approve (20%). Strong opposition to the new plates is common to females (42%), among past NDP (48%) and Green voters (40%) and among those disapproving of Doug Ford (44%).

Majority would rather keep old plate, reject new plate

Close to 6-in-10 respondents would prefer to keep their old plate (58%), while fewer than one fifth think the new plate should be adopted (16%). Preference for the old plates is highest among females (67%), past NDP voters (73%), past Liberals (67%) and those who disapprove of Doug Ford (69%).

Two thirds oppose cuts to teachers by attrition

Fully two thirds of Ontario voters oppose the Ford government's plan to eliminate more than 3000 teaching jobs in the next four years through attrition (62%), most of them "strongly" (48%), while fewer than one quarter support this plan (23%). Strong opposition to this plan is characteristic of women (55%), the young (55%), among past NDP (72%) and Liberals (62%) and those who disapprove of Ford (66%).

One half opposes increase in elementary school class sizes

One half oppose increases in class size in elementary schools from 23 to 24 students (47%), most "strongly" (35%), while just 3-in-10 support the plan (30%). Strong opposition is higher among females (41%), past Liberals (47%), the NDP (54%), those disapproving of Ford (50%) and those certain to vote (40%).

Six-in-ten oppose increasing class sizes in high school

Six-in-ten oppose the policy of increasing high school classes from 22 to 28 students (59%), most "strongly" (44%), while just one quarter support it (25%). Strong opposition is common to females (51%), past Liberals (56%) and NDP voters (67%), Ford disapprovers (61%) and those certain to vote (50%).

Majority opposes required online courses

The majority oppose the plan to require high school students to take at least 4 online courses (57%), most of them "strongly" (39%), while just one fifth support it (21%). Strong opposition is higher among females (47%), past Liberals (46%), New Democrats (56%) and those who disapprove of Ford (52%).

Conclusion

"The obvious conclusion is that key Ford government policies face significant opposition, either in their implementation or in their outcome. It looks like the Ford government may have to revisit key agenda items and policy initiatives" said John Corbett, principal and founder of Corbett Communications.

Methodology

This poll was conducted by Corbett Communications on May 2 and 3, 2019, among an online sample of 1836 Ontario voters 18 years of age and older who are members of Maru/Blue's Maru Voice Canada Online Panel. Panel members are recruited to reflect the population profile described in 2016 Statistics Canada data and are paid various incentives for their participation.

As this is an opt-in sample, no margin of error is presented. For comparison purposes, a randomly selected sample of this size would have a margin of error of plus or minus 2.4%, nineteen out of twenty times asking.

Where appropriate, data has been weighted to ensure the sample matches the actual population profile according to the latest Statistics Canada data.

This poll is not intended to predict the future but is a "slice of time" view of public opinion. Corbett Communications has released this poll in the public interest and has no stake in its results.
